

Containing the Spread of COVID-19

The following is based on CDC recommendations

Person 2

Person 2 should self-quarantine for 14 days from date of last contact with Person 1 and self-monitor for symptoms.

The CDC defines **Close Contact** as:

- being within approximately 6 feet of Person 1 for an extended period of time, or
- having direct contact with infectious secretions of Person 1 (i.e., being coughed on).

The Los Angeles County Department of Health further defines Close Contact as being within 6 feet for more than 10 minutes with Person 1.

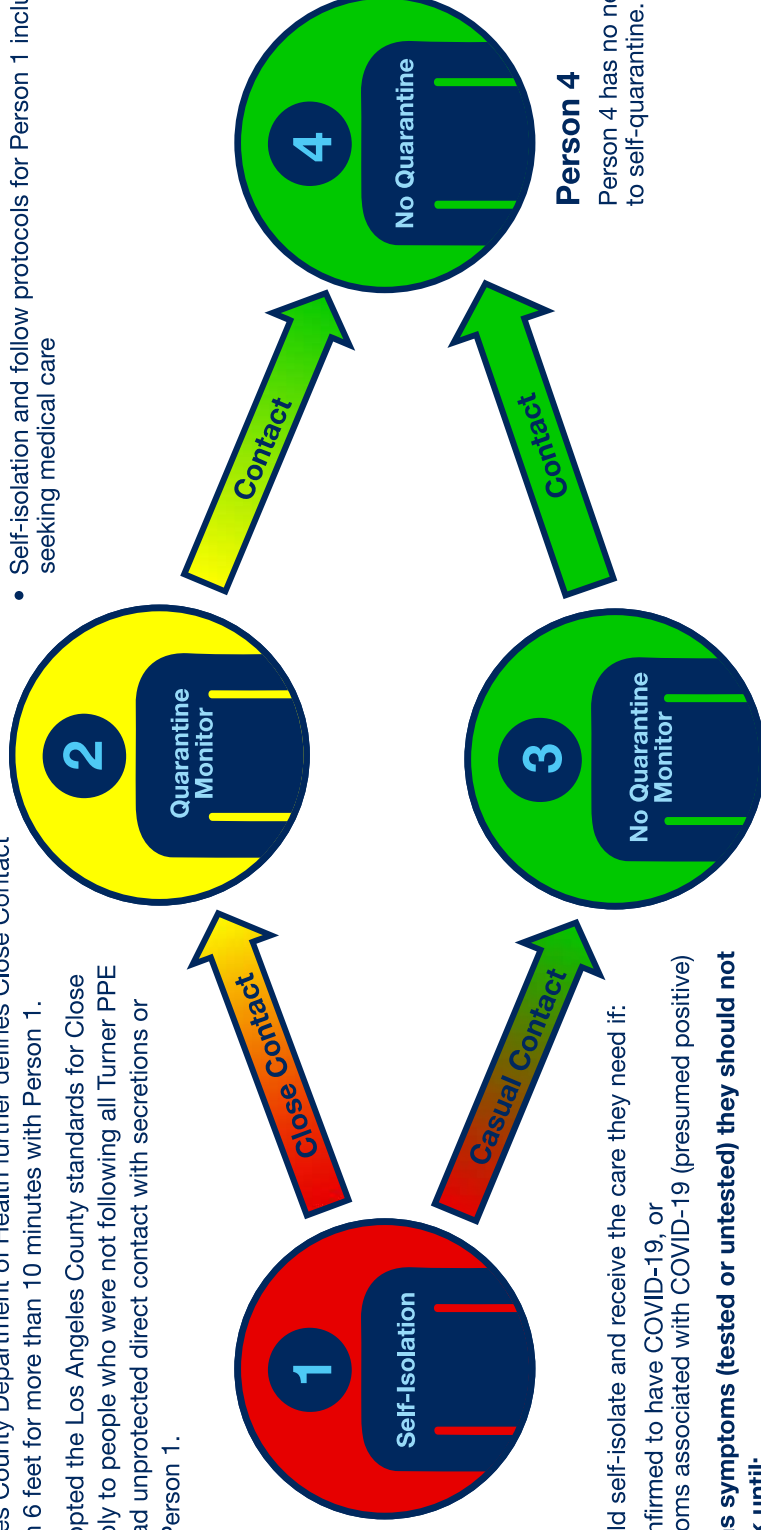
Turner has adopted the Los Angeles County standards for Close Contact to apply to people who were not following all Turner PPE protocols or had unprotected direct contact with secretions or excretions of Person 1.

If Person 2 does not have symptoms

- As symptoms may not appear for 2 to 14 days after exposure, remain at home for 14 days or in a comparable setting
- Practice physical distancing
- Actively monitor for symptoms

If Person 2 develops symptoms

- Self-isolation and follow protocols for Person 1 including seeking medical care



Person 1

Person 1 should self-isolate and receive the care they need if:

- They are confirmed to have COVID-19, or
- Have symptoms associated with COVID-19 (presumed positive)

If Person 1 has symptoms (tested or untested) they should not return to work until:

- At least 72 hours after the resolution of symptoms without the use of medication, and
- At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared, and
- A doctor confirms it is safe

If Person 1 received a positive nasal swab test result and does not have symptoms they should not return to work until:

- At least 14 days have passed since the first positive COVID-19 nasal swab test, and
- Has not subsequently developed symptoms, and
- A doctor confirms it is safe

Person 3

Person 3 has no need to self-quarantine. Person 3 should self-monitor for symptoms.

Casual Contact would include working in the same indoor environment, such as an office or project site, with Person 1, for a prolonged period of time but not meeting the definition of Close Contact. It would also include incidental interactions with Person 1 such as walking by the person or being briefly in the same room. Person 3 may include people within 6 feet of Person 1 for 10 minutes or more IF both persons are using full PPE and following all Turner PPE protocols.
